Dear Councilmember Leventhal,

For the record, I strongly disagree with Ms. Howland's summation that there are no other viable options for the land at Sligo Creek Golf Course that are environmentally-friendly and economically sustainable. I would like to provide my viewpoints on a proposal being put forth by Peter Guida and Brad Beeson of Bethesda Bungalows to turn Sligo Creek Golf Course into Sligo Creek Disc Golf Course. This proposal is not only compatible with the surrounding neighborhoods but also environmentally sound and fiscally responsible. I am fully endorsing this proposal for the future use of the Sligo Creek Golf Course (or at least for the interim use) for the following reasons:

1. Environmentally Sound Choice for Sligo Creek:

First and foremost this plan is a much more environmentally-friendly use of this ecologically sensitive site than its current use. If the site is converted to a Disc Golf Course there will be much less mowing, no irrigation, and no application of fertilizers or pesticides. There

would be no removal of mature trees, new trees would actually be planted, compaction of soil would not occur, and stormwater runoff from the site into Sligo Creek would be reduced. The overall health of the existing green space would be dramatically improved thus the health of Sligo Creek would be better protected as well as the health of our families!

2. Popularity of Disc Golf and Longevity of the Sport:

The game of Disc Golf is an up and coming sport and gaining popularity with both men and women and attracting all age ranges. The sport is very budget-friendly (it only takes a \$10 disc to play it) and people of all skill levels can enjoy it. In addition if you have doubts about the longevity of the sport then I highly recommend that everyone on this distribution list please go visit the two closest disc golf courses to the Silver Spring area:

1. Calvert Road Park houses the Paint Branch Disc Golf Course in PG County:

This course has been around since 1980 (almost 30 years!) and it is a mixed use site with tennis courts, picnic areas, and a children's playground

2. Seneca Creek State Park houses the Seneca Disc Golf Course in Gaithersburg (this is the only Montgomery County course):

It was established in 1990 (almost 20 years) and it is also a mixed use site.

Both of these courses are well-maintained, have small parking lots, are very quiet and very clean (I've never seen any trash at either course).

3. Economical Choice for Montgomery County Tax Payers:

The overall cost of converting the site to a Disc Golf Course will cost about \$30K. Compare that to the \$5.5M proposal put forth by MCRA to create a driving range and mini golf courses or compare it to the outrageous cost it will take to convert the site to soccer fields (Montgomery Soccer estimates to install just one field it could cost as much as \$1.1M!) and I think you would agree that Disc Golf is the more economical option for the site.

The actual proposal is included below. I look forward to hearing from you, other Councilmembers, M-NCPPC, and the Planning Board on this matter.

A Bold Green Vision for the Future of Sligo Creek Golf Course

A championship-level 18 hole disc golf course is being proposed to replace Sligo Creek Golf Course. Tentatively named Sligo Creek Disc Golf Course, the facility would be the first of its kind developed by Montgomery County Department of Parks. Disc golf, also known as "Frisbee golf", is similar to ball golf, with baskets as targets. Disc golf appeals to all ages, men and women, regardless of economic status.

The proposal seeks to address all of the local community's environmental concerns, while providing the county an inexpensive alternative to other competing proposals. The sport is naturally low-impact, with a dramatically reduced mowing schedule, no irrigation, and no application of fertilizers or pesticides. There would be no removal of mature trees, no compaction of soil and reduced stormwater runoff into Sligo Creek. The overall health of the

existing green space would be improved, while allowing up to 75 players to compete at one time.

Disc golf is perhaps the fastest growing sport in America. The number of courses nationwide has doubled in the past eight years to over 2500. Membership in the professional Disc Golf Association (PDGA) has grown from just over 6000 in 2000 to over 13,000 in 2008.

The course would provide passive recreation for the whole family, drawing participants from around the region. The facility could also be actively programmed through leagues, casual weekly tournaments, and PDGA-sanctioned tournaments. Disc golf is played year round in all weather conditions.

Revenue would be generated by sales of discs, disc golf accessories such as carrying bags, and clothing. Tournament and league fees will also generate revenue. A dozen manufacturers offer a choice of discs and accessory equipment, including Gateway, Innova and Discraft.

Bethesda Bungalows, a local custom home builder specializing in green building, has pledged support of the effort, offering to sponsor installation of at least two of the eighteen holes. Bethesda Bungalows will also donate 20 saplings to be planted on the property. Brad Beeson, Vice President of Bethesda Bungalows says, "It's a perfect fit. Disc golf is a super green sport undergoing a dramatic increase in popularity. The county needs to get on the bandwagon. The foundation is already in place to make Sligo Creek Disc Golf course a championship-level facility. The rolling hills and mature trees are an ideal backdrop. It would draw professionals and amateurs from across the country, while giving the local community a great low-cost recreation alternative. As a disc golf enthusiast, it's an exciting proposal."

The change-over from the existing course to the disc golf course could be completed in as little as two weeks, with no heavy construction period. The development period consists of installing tee pads (possibly pervious concrete), baskets and signage. Development would be so unobtrusive that county building permits or sediment control permits would likely not be necessary. Total cost for developing the eighteen-hole course, including course design, is expected to be under \$30,000.

Maintenance of a disc course is greatly reduced compared to a traditional golf course. Generally, mowing is reduced to approximately 15 times a year, with no requirement for manicured turf. Nationwide, disc golf is supported by enthusiastic volunteers who dramatically reduce maintenance costs on their courses. A local club, tentatively named Sligo Creek Disc Golf Club, will be established as the volunteer organization charged with upkeep and monitoring of the facility, alongside Montgomery County and other community organizations such as Friends of Sligo Creek.

A major reason for the growth of the sport is the low upfront costs to the beginning player. A single disc costing \$10 can be used to play an entire course. A professional may carry dozens of various discs, each with slightly different flight characteristics.

Other amenities proposed are a disc golf putting range, and a SkillShot course, based on design parameters from EDGE Disc Golf, an educational non-profit developed to provide schools and other youth programs with a sound program of teaching disc golf fundamentals and allied skills. Other lawn sports such as croquet, horseshoes, and quoits could also be considered for the existing manicured areas near the pro shop, and add to revenue thru equipment rental.

A community meeting to discuss the future of the property is schedule for Tuesday May 26th at 7pm at the Montgomery Regional Office Auditorium, 8787 Georgia Avenue, Silver Spring, Maryland 20910.

The public has an opportunity to witness a PDGA-sanctioned professional disc golf tournament June 6th and 7th at the 18th Annual Seneca Soiree, Seneca Creek State Park, Gaithersburg, MD. Play starts at 9am, but feel free to stop by anytime. Park entrance fee is \$2 per person. Several renowned disc golf professionals will participate including local favorites, Craig Gangloff and John Gregory.

Mr. Leventhal -

We appreciate that there are no immediate proposals to develop the land for residential purposes. That said, there is concern that if a financially and environmentally friendly/feasible recreational use of the land is not pursued that there will be future consideration of those types of proposals.

As a taxpayer, I can say I would rather subsidize the relatively small "loss" that SCGC is showing than to subsidize the millions of dollars it would take to create soccer fields or some of the other proposed uses of the land. The least costly solution is to maintain it as a golf course. We continue to be skeptical of the book keeping and unavoidable big ticket maintenance costs that have been suggested are needed for SCGC. The golf system as a whole is self-sustaining and I have no problem with the bigger courses (e.g., Northwest, Falls Road) subsidizing our only senior and beginner course inside the beltway. After all, Little Bennett is the biggest money loser and it is being subsidized by the golf system as a whole. The financial burden argument does not pass the red face test. Taxpayers subsidize lots of amenities, why single out golf courses as one amenity that shouldn't be subsidized?

If concerned community members could so easily see the flaws in the MCRA's arguments and ask for more scrutiny and careful consideration, why did the council accept the disbandment of the course without question? It seems that the most fiscally responsible and environmentally sound action for the taxpayers is to not pursue other options. We will work to ensure that an acceptable solution is reached if it is not maintained as a golf course. Obviously, the devil is in the details and we await the details.

Re: The PArk and Planning Staff Meeting on the Golf Course

I'll chime in as Jeff suggested in his note about last night's meeting, so this can be part of the public record (thanks Rachel Newhouse). Park and Planning staff were not prepared for the outrage and anger we citizens leveled at them. In their defense, the anger is more properly directed at our County Council - which has failed to take this issue seriously and underestimates the community's passion for this course. Their lack of presence last night (with the notable exception of our State Representative Jeff Waldsteicher) is another indicator that they aren't listening to us.

We are establishing a website (perhaps a Facebook group page) to provide a better forum for bringing the groups from all neighborhoods (down county, mid and up) together to fight the Council's decisions and the crazy contract that gives a quasi-governmental group (MCRA) a monopoly and the right to prevent SCGC from being a golf course. We will communicate specifics soon.

Key points that they must address and answer to us on:

1) Revisit the classification of golf courses as an "Enterprise" operation, which therefore can not be subsidized by taxpayer dollars.

We learned last night that this is a big roadblock for P&P operating them. It is also why their mission and plans don't include down-county golf facilities as a "need" for citizens like soccer and softball fields. We also learned that PG, Annarundel, and other Maryland counties classify golf as a Recreational Amenity (as they should be) rather than an Enterprise.

2) Dig into the financial information about the golf operation.

Get a true independent group to assess what it is costing and/or what it SHOULD cost to operate the course. Make sure that the decision wasn't rushed and based on questionable data. The Deputy Director of P&P committed last night that they would have to do a financial analysis so they are able to consider proposing keeping it as a golf course. We citizens need to ensure that there is transparency in the numbers and allow citizen participation in

the review. They need to make sense. We also should insist that they not be based on MCRA's proposed or projected costs.

3) Renegotiate the contract with MCRA.

First, read it closely. The community members read it to mean that the golf system as a WHOLE needs to be self-sustaining not every individual course. If that's the case, MCRA should be subsidizing this valued niche course with revenue from the others. I'm told this happens with the indoor tennis facilities. Second, as stated in item 2 above, it needs to be a truly independent analysis. Third, ELIMINATE the language that prevents SCGC from being operated by any other party as a golf course. MCRA claims it is a competitive threat to the other larger courses. That's ludicrous. On the one hand poor SCGC is a big time loser, on the other it will take away players from the other big courses. As was made VERY clear last night, the predominant players of SCGC don't want to or won't play the big courses. SCGC targets beginners, youth, women, and seniors. These players are intimidated by or slow down play on larger courses.

For those who may not have been following this 2+ year saga, I have also copied the earlier letter I sent to the council to remind people that the concerns that Park and Planning were hammered with last night have been voiced directly to the council. Also, many of the marketing ideas that were suggested last night were part of our committee's recommendation to the MCRA. I see no evidence of them having pursued any measures to increase course revenue. And we were told last night that they operate it less hours than the course used to be operated. That too would lessen revenue.

The Council has been asked to retract their decision and spend the time to do due diligence reviewing the financial arguments. At the very least renegotiate the "non-compete" clause. I can say other than a very perfunctory email from Phil Andrews saying the decision was made and a similar note from Duchy Trachtenberg the Council members have been silent. Perhaps they know they didn't take the time to make sure this was the correct decision and they can't respond to specific concerns. Whatever the reason, they owe us more.

We were told last night by the lawyer and Deputy Director that "where there is the will, there is a way."

Even if you aren't a golfer, keeping it a golf course is the most fiscally responsible use of taxpayer dollars versus millions of dollars to develop alternatives. It is also the most environmentally friendly course of action.

Reconsider the decision to let MCRA drop Sligo Creek Golf Course

Council Members -

I'm writing on behalf of many neighbors in the Woodside Forest community who have been shocked to learn that you approved the MCRA's request to turn Sligo Creek Golf Course back to Park and Planning. I represented the Woodside Forest Civic association on the committee that worked with the MCRA this past year to address Keith Miller's concerns about profitability. I can attest to the frustration other committee members have shared about not being given access to the "numbers" that would shed true light on the financial situation. I'll highlight a couple of items that I believe merit further assessment before you give in to the MCRA's request.

- * The contract identifies Sligo Creek Golf Course as desirable to support providing access to golf for lower income families and youth. Why has MCRA strayed from that mission for the course? Do we drop a facility that meets that overall purpose for the public golf system?
- * The MCRA decision to assess a management fee for a 9 hole course equal to that of the 27 hole courses is arbitrary. This higher management fee has only existed the last couple of years under Keith Miller. It conveniently makes the numbers not work for Sligo Creek Golf Course and should be challenged.
- * The contract only demands that the golf system as a whole (i.e., the combined revenue of all courses) break even or make a profit. The system as a whole is profitable. Although I challenge whether SCGC is really losing money, even if it is the other courses can subsidize Sligo Creek golf course in order for the public to continue to have access to this facility targeted to beginners, seniors, and lower income families.
- * Keith Miller claims there is millions of dollars worth of maintenance needed for SCGC. Seriously that's hogwash don't buy it. For example, there is no need to put golf paths in on Sligo. The majority of people walk the course and the existing paths are fine. The course has fared quite well even without the irrigation system working. Any of the items he lists are ones that we can choose to not do or, at the very least, defer for a long time until financial situation allows it.
- * The report given to justify dropping SCGC did not include the revenue that the course gets from Holy Cross Hospital for parking spaces. How much does that offset the purported losses?
- * The contract requires an objective third party to assess whether a course is a detriment to the overall golf system. I wouldn't call a consultant paid for by the MCRA an objective third party. To the contrary, the report looked like a rehash of Keith Miller's

arguments for putting in the lighted driving range. The council should appoint an objective third party to scrutinize the practices and numbers.

There are probably more things that should be investigated, but the above by themselves should be enough to revisit your decision to accept the MCRA's ejection of SCGC from the public golf system. Sligo Creek Golf Course has for over 60 years provided exactly what the contract outlined – a facility that supports beginners, seniors, lower income families and youth who wouldn't normally have access to golf. Entering into this long lasting contract with the MCRA – giving them a monopoly on public courses with a non-compete clause – was a seriously flawed decision. Letting them dictate which courses should be supported for the tax payers use is also a seriously flawed decision and adds insult to injury. This is not a "for-profit" endeavor. The MCRA should be working for the overall good of the tax payers and communities these courses service. Unfortunately, Keith Miller wants to run the system as if it were a private entity.

I ask that you reconsider your decision and demand that the MCRA do what it was contracted to do - operate the public golf system as a whole to break even. The public golf courses are amenities for the community not profit centers.

I would appreciate your response. Thank you in advance for your action on this matter.

Thank you so much for speaking with me about the radio tower located on the grounds of Sligo Park Golf Course. As I mentioned on the phone, the tower is used by

two commercial AM radio stations as well as the Department of Public Works and the Park Police.

The commercial radio stations transmit at this location as licensed by the FCC and have long lease agreements with the county.

The county needs to be aware that this particular transmitting site for the commercial stations is determined by engineering requirements established by the

FCC.

If for any reason use of the tower was denied because of a re-use plan for the Golf Course, it would be very expensive if not impossible for these stations to find

a new transmitting tower facility.

Dear Ms. Newhouse.

I am writing about the future use of the Sligo Golf Course, where my husband and I played a round yesterday. It sounds like the decision has already been made to close the course. First, I am urging you to reconsider this decision, and secondly, I have some suggestions for its future use if the course will indeed be closing.

First, has everything possible been done to consider keeping the course open for play? I value having a 9-hole public course near to my home. My husband and I have played at Sligo probably about 4 times a summer for the past few years, sometimes w/ friends. We enjoy walking rather than riding – it's far better exercise, and at many public courses, I feel less than welcome if I want to walk for 9 holes, rather than get an electric cart and play 18, like most of the "gung-ho" golfers. I feel that Sligo has been (and I would hope continues to be) an excellent place to introduce new golfers to the game, whether our children, or non-playing friends. It's easier to get a tee-time, and the green fees are cheaper than the other courses, which are often a long drive outside the Beltway.

I have been following the financial difficulties of the course in the press, and am aware the neighbors voted down the proposed driving range facility. It seems a shame to close the course, when 5 or 10 years from now, the newly revived Silver Spring area my be crying out for public golf facilities, which would be far more expensive to build from scratch—perhaps there is a way the old course can lie dormant, with the idea that in the future in could be reopened (ie, no paving, no cutting down beautiful old oak trees, keep the basic lie of the fairways as open space.

If there is absolutely no way that the course can remain open, I have the following suggestions for the valuable green space inside the beltway. I would recommend two or three holes be reconfigured to a par-3/pitch and putt type course, even if just a few holes, so kids and novices could come get a taste of golf — maybe even for free. Just bring your own clubs. The rest of the course could be retained as wooded open space for a dog park and or jogging route. This would preserve the green space (we saw a deer on hole 9 at midday yesterday), while allowing for the course to possibly reopen in some form in a few years when the financial situation may be more favorable.

The two sections of the MNCPPC/ MCRA golf course lease which, I assume ,were used by MCRA to extract and return Sligo Creek course are Section 12.2 and Section 2.1. The lease ,as you know, is on your website. I believe Section 2.1 could be used to allow the county to continue to use Sligo as a golf course. Anecdotally , there are <u>no</u> nine hole courses run by MCRA near Sligo and the closest one, Northwest inside nine, is generally crowded.

The expense a the study required by Section 2.1 should be small compared to the costs of using the land for other purposes and compared to the loss of the <u>only</u> golf course located in the area where most of the counties population resides, where most of the counties minority populations reside and where many of the counties senior citizens play.

Most studies of golfer behavior show that proximity, cost, and companions to play with dictate the golfer's choice of course. Seniors will be particularly hard hit by the loss of Sligo for the following reasons: nine holes are cheaper than 18 holes and driving distance from downtown sliver spring to sligo is shorter than to Northwest

Finally, I have played at most of the MCRA courses, and it is my experience that Sligo is the most multiracial and multiethnic course and also attracts golfers of every age. The closure of Sligo will Have a disparate effect on the counties minority populations. Many more minorities live near Sligo than Falls Road, Little Bennett, Red Gate, etc.

Please let me know if such a study is planned ASAP. Time is of the essence in this matter since we are only a few months away from the possible closure of the course.

Either myself or the other coach will be coming to the meeting.

Home meets for the XC regular season typically involve 2-3 schools, but occasionally as many as 4. It is possible to make a special request to have a specific number for the meet, especially if the course can only really handle 2 teams. A smaller meet with only two teams would involve typically up to 100 runners who would be broken up into two races (boys and girls). A 2-3 hour block of time would be needed (say 2:30-5:00) A meet with four teams can be significantly larger and is usually broken up into four races and would need a bit more time (say 2:30-5:30 or 6:00).

As for improvements, they would be minor, if any. There is plenty of parking in the area and I assume there are already bathroom facilities and potable water as well. IF there were any improvements to be requested, it would likely be something like creating a short path through a wooded area to make it safe to run on (something we could even do for free with permission). Even this is not necessarily required, but it could be helpful to make a better course and one that stays further away from the actual greens on the course.

While I am confident there is enough space to run a meet, I have not previously scouted out the golf course to develop a specific course, especially since I was told it was not a possibility. Would it be alright if I came by one day simply to walk around the golf course, take some measurements and come up with a proposed course? It would also be helpful to know which areas are off limits. I assume the putting greens are off limits, but I am not as sure about the driving greens. Another important detail would be developing a rain policy for the meet. We only cancel because of lightening, not because of heavy rain. But in heavy rain, there does tend to be some wear and tear. Considering the small size of the meet, the wear and tear would be minimal, even in heavy rain – but I do know that golf courses are sensitive to that. I would certainly do my best to keep the XC course away from the more pristine areas that are more difficult to upkeep – I simply need some guidance as to where those areas are.

Rachel,

I am the Cross Country Coach at Montgomery Blair HS, which considering our school is bordered by 495, 193 and 29 is a rather difficult proposition. We often joke that we run XC in a concrete jungle and that statement is probably not far off the mark.

We are currently the only school in the entire county that does not have a home course. This is basically due to the fact that not only does our campus have virtually no green space, there are no large areas nearby that also have green space. The Sligo Golf Course is essentially the best nearby option for us to have a home course for one meet in the fall once a year.

I had made one phone call inquiring about this, although I do not remember who I talked too. I was basically told that this was not a possibility. It's a shame because golf courses are used on a regular basis for cross country courses and are often very good courses to run on. And for us it is not only the best option, but one of the very few even remotely viable options in the area. Our next best option is Wheaton Regional which is already used by most of the down county consortium schools and therefore not truly a home course if we use that park and not as close to us as the Sligo Golf course either.

Is there any chance to discuss the possibility of allowing Montgomery Blair to host one small meet at the golf course in September or October during the weekday around 3-5:30pm? We are likely flexible with dates and I also understand the concerns of maintaining the golf course. We would certainly do our best to avoid the more pristine greens from any serious wear and tear.

If this is even an option, I could certainly come out to the golf course and propose an actual course for the XC meet.

I am very open to any questions, concerns, etc. as I am very interested in finding a way to make this work.

As you likely know, *Friends of Sligo Creek* has a very high interest in the contribution that the ~70-acres of the golf course can make (or not) to the ecological health of Sligo woods and waters. I've been under the impression that you all at P&P didn't particularly want to meet with interested parties prior to the public meeting on the 26th--but it finally occurs to me to ask you that directly. I'm one of the designated pointpeople for *Friends of Sligo Creek* on this issue; president Bruce Sidwell is another, and he is out of the country so i offered to be in touch with you. I'd be glad to come over to talk with you sometime during the next week if you'd be open to that.

And this detail: back when the Revenue Authority was producing their plan for the driving range on the course, they got a consultant to do a survey of trees. It appeared that the report was entirely linked to the requirements of the Forest Conservation and other regs but, in the process, there was an inventory and detailed map—the latter used at a public meeting at Holy Cross hospital. It occurs to me that, regardless of the inventorying that may yet take place, it would be of interest to get hold of that January 2008 (?) report/map.
