Matt Johnson told me to send my concerns regarding the circle at Violet and Woodbury to you. My son rides a school bus every day that specifically parks at the circle on Violet and Woodbury because there is extra space there for the bus to come in and turn around.

Regarding the area of Woodbury and Violet, I prefer Option 1, the circle, over Option 2, the two-T's. One reason that I prefer this is that it provides more driving space so that a school bus can park for 30 minutes while cars can still get around the bus. I am requesting a designated parking area for the bus with no parking signs during the hours the bus would be there (i.e. 6am to 8am, 4pm to 6pm, for instance). Another reason is that I am concerned about the two-T's

option putting lots of extra real estate next to existing private homes' properties, exacerbating an ongoing problem in our neighborhood of residents claiming public property as their own private property. I am also requesting as much advance notice as possible before the actual construction work on the circle at Violet and Woodbury starts.

Thank you for your comments. I will include these in the record for the public hearing.

Treatments like Grove Street are not proposed on Woodbury Drive. No speed humps or flex posts are proposed. Bicycles and vehicles will share the lane, and each lane will remain 12 feet wide. The main improvement on Woodbury Drive is the installation of a more formal traffic circle at the Violet Place and Richmond Avenue intersection, which will reduce conflicts between motor vehicles and improve safety. I've attached the plan drawings; take a look at pages 65-66.

Regarding the Fenton Street bike lane, that is a standalone project and not included in this Mandatory Referral. Here is the current MCDOT webpage for Fenton Street. The MCDOT team has almost completed the design, and they expect construction to begin in early 2025—likely to last 18 to 24 months. Please reach out to the MCDOT project manager, Matt Johnson (Matt.Johnson@montgomervcountymd.gov), for more information about that project.

MCDOT and Montgomery Planning have a shared goal to make all roads "complete streets"—which means safe and comfortable for all road-users (pedestrians, bikes, vehicles, etc.). The postcard that I received in the mail from Montgomery Planning reminded me that Planning was continuing to develop its Grove Street Greenway by excpanding it to my neighborhood, which I'd heard about earlier this year at meetings about the Grove Street Greenway. I live on Gist Avenue, the third house from Woodbury Drive and the Woodbury Circle Garden. Woodbury has been a designated bike route for many years, with painted graphics on the asphalt indicating a cycling route. It does NOT have a lot of vehicle traffic that must be "managed" with "improvements" like those installed on Grove Street to create a "Greenway".

As a longtime resident, pedestrian and cyclist, I appreciate the smooth quiet neighborhood feeling of Woodbury Drive and do not want Woodbury narrowed, reduced in width by installation of poles to separate pedestrians and cyclists from vehicles. I do not want speed humps and cushions installed on Woodbury, which is a short road with sidewalks on both sides.

I understand that a bike crossing will be designated with signage and painted markings on Sligo Avenue at its intersection with Woodbury, and that the bike route will run on the sidewalk along Sligo (in front of ArtSpace) to Grove Street, where it continues. In addition, if there is a designated bike route on Woodbury/Sligo/Grove/Cedar, etc., what need is there for one on Fenton Street, which is terribly congested most of the time? Narrowing intersections on Fenton Street some years ago is the reason that Grove Street become the preferred local route to bypass traffic, bus stops, congestion on Fenton. Grove was lightly used when Fenton Street was more open. Only county police sped up and down Grove Street, where no barriers existed for decades.

As I've stated above, Woodbury Drive does not need the improvements that Grove Street received, and I hope you will take my comments into consideration as you move forward with plans.

I'd appreciate any information you can provide about "improvements" planned for Woodbury, along with information about the proposed bike lane on Fenton Street.
