I am a neighbor and member of the Luxmanor community. Please consider the below statements when evaluating the request to increase enrollment in Alef Bet in Rockville, MD on Tuckerman lane.

No increase in enrollment should be approved at this time as the impact to traffic and the neighborhood can not be properly evaluated until after September 2020 when three MCPS schools reopen - Tilden Middle School, Rock Terrace School and Luxmanor Elementary School.

Traffic in the Luxmanor community and specifically on Tuckerman is already difficult. This is only the tip of the iceberg because Tilden Middle School, Rock Terrace School and Luxmanor Elementary School are all currently under construction. When those school open in Sept 2020, traffic in and around the neighborhood during school hours is going to be almost unmanageable.

I would like to express my opposition to the proposed expansion of Alef Bet Montessori's student capacity from 39 to 90 students. I live on Whisperwood La, a street off Tuckerman La a few blocks down from the school. I have experienced first hand on many occasions the bottleneck of traffic on Tuckerman La during periods of both the beginning and end of the school day.

The owners of the school have not been good neighbors. They have repeatedly delayed negotiations with our group, Concerns About the School. They have demonstrated no desire to "preserve the feel and atmosphere of this quiet neighborhood".

Just the other day, as I turned off Old Georgetown Rd onto Tuckerman La, approaching the school was a nightmare. There was a car stopped directly if front of the school. This is legal, since the posted signs prohibit parking, not stopping, during school starting/ending times. Most of my career has been in real estate, and I am familiar with the public hearings and the process. Never have I seen such an underhanded means of working the system, bypassing community comment, or postponing a public hearing as is the case with Alef Bet.

INADEQUATE NOTICE



CUT THROUGH TRAFFIC INTO WINDERMERE AND LUXMANOR

Granting Alef Bet its request to permit an increase in permissible enrollment to 90 is outrageous, because an increase in enrollment would result in a traffic impediment on Tuckerman Lane and unwanted cut through traffic into Windermere and Luxmanor.



When there is heavy traffic or a delay along Tuckerman Lane, smart phone navigation technologies like WAZE are responsible for redirecting vehicular traffic through Windermere and Luxmanor via Ralston Road, Lux Lane, and Rosemont Drive. The magnitude of the problem, when traffic is backed up or comes to a halt on Tuckerman Lane, is such that tensions erupted amongst residents of both Windermere and Luxmanor in 2018 and 2019 as a result of numerous concerns over pedestrian safety and unwelcomed cut through traffic.

The Heritage Walk Homeowners Association and the Luxmanor Citizens Association were at odds over 11 different proposals stemming from these concerns for sidewalks, stop signs, no cut through signs, restricted access signs, and more. Permitting increased enrollment at Alef Bet would only exacerbate simmering problems that still exist here.

Neither Windermere nor Luxmanor were designed for cut through traffic from Tuckerman Lane. Both sub urban communities have no sidewalks due to their design as estate styled properties. And, both communities rejected the county's proposal to put in sidewalks.

Windermere features a community magnet for nearby subdivisions, which is a one mile trek around Windermere Circle and other streets that is safe for pedestrians, parents with strollers, those in wheelchairs, children, bikers, skateboarders, and pet walkers. Those, who walk our community also walk Wayside Way, which is the main route used by those, who cut through Windermere to bypass sitting traffic on Tuckerman Lane.

Never has anyone in Windermere considered posting a sign at Arroyo Drive, Ralston Road, or Lux Lane that says: Residents Only or No Cut Through. Yet, such a request was made for Rosemont Drive in Luxmanor due to this very real problem, which was a perceived threat to personal and family safety - all stemming from cut through traffic. The individual, who made the request for restricted access on Rosemont Drive has listed their home for sale after just two short years of living here. Transaction costs during such a short stay represents financial loss.

Again, an increase in cut through traffic into Windermere due to redirection from Tuckerman when backed up in front of Alef Bet poses a serious problem for the residents of Windermere, and a risk to safety for those who come from Arroyo Estates, Tilden Woods, The Oaks, Luxmanor, and beyond to walk our community.

RISK TO SAFETY

As it is now, Alef Bet's location on Tuckerman Lane - not on a campus location off the main street - is an accident waiting to happen.

In the month of December 2019 alone in lower Montgomery County, a 12th grade student of Walter Johnson High School was hit by a car while crossing the street to board the school bus. Also, a 4th grade student of Bradley Hills Elementary School died within 24 hours of being hit by a car.

Please, do not grant any approval for an increase in enrollment for Alef Bet at the Tuckerman Lane location.

For the following reasons, we are strongly opposed to increased enrollment of the Alef Bet school (day care.)

- 1. Increased enrollment will necessarily result in a prolonged traffic stoppage on Tuckerman Lane every morning and afternoon. (Accidents and passing on the right are inevitable).
- 2. The Tuckerman and Old Georgetown intersection is already designated a failed intersection due to inability to manage traffic capacity.
- 3. Increased enrollment will necessarily result in more cut though traffic into our community via Arroyo, Ralston, Lux, and Rosemont when traffic on Tuckerman Lane is stopped.
- 4. Cut through traffic will be further exacerbated due to the widespread use of WAYZ, a navigation application on smart phones.
- 5. We must bear in mind that the construction of new townhouses at Cabin John Mall will necessarily result in more traffic along Tuckerman as commuters make their way to either Grosvenor metro and I-270 and I-495. [SEE https://northbethesdamagazine.com/development] That is not the only development in the approved pipeline near our community.
- 6. Windermere was not designed to accommodate cut through traffic. We bought here, we repurchased here when we gutted and remodeled, because Windermere remains an enclave, secluded, quiet, and more. A school campus on Tuckerman, across from our community, forces us to take notice and act.
- 7. Windermere has no sidewalks, and the residents overwhelmingly rejected them when proposed by the county. We don't want to lose our mature tree canopy.
- 8. Our community is a walking mecca that attracts walkers throughout the dat from Windermere, the Oaks, Luxmanor, Tilden Woods, and Arroyo Estates.
- 9. We have already had incidences of walkers being chased to the curb by drivers not mindful of our community's history families walking here without concern.
