## SUMMARY

Cultural resources staff from Planning and Parks will present an overview of relevant existing conditions for the Takoma Park Minor Master Plan Amendment. The Planning Board was previously briefed on the remaining elements of the plan’s existing conditions on March 31. Staff is seeking guidance and feedback for next steps.

## OVERVIEW

The scope of work and plan boundary for the Takoma Park Minor Master Plan Amendment (TPMMA) were approved by the Planning Board on September 20, 2021. Since that time, historic preservation staff have evaluated existing historic resources within the plan boundary, identified gaps in existing documentation and survey, and established areas of inquiry for expanded documentation and potential historic property designations. Planning staff will present an overview of these findings and next steps in the process.

Montgomery Parks’ Cultural Resources Stewardship Section staff will also discuss cultural resources identified on Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (M-NCPPC) managed park land within the TPMMA area.
