

Additional Information:

Joseph Newman purchased the property in 1872 (Liber EBP 9 Folio 483). George Rhodes inherited the portion of the Newman property containing the cemetery. Joseph Newman's 1907 will reads in part: "To George S. Rhodes, my brother-in-law, and his heirs, Four and three quarter acres of land situated at Beans, Montgomery County, Md. being the part of my estate which said George now lives." Rhodes heirs later sold the property to the Wildwood Manor Swim Club in 1959 (Liber 2587 Folio 167).

In 2023, archaeologists contracted by the Swim Club successfully identified 13 graves arranged in 3 rows in the approximate area indicated as a graveyard in a 1958 survey map of the Rhodes property prior to construction of the pool. The archaeological work consisted of removing only the topsoil to reveal the tops of grave shafts underneath. No burials were disturbed by the work. The effort was designed to identify the approximate boundary of the burial area with as little disturbance as possible. Additional graves within the bounds of the graveyard identified by the archaeologists are possible along side of the 13 exposed by the limited excavations.
