Montgomery Parks Director, Miti Figueredo, offered brief comments regarding disc golf within Montgomery County and Chuck Kines, Park Planner III, Eric Dintaman, Parks Design and Construction Project Manager II, and Bob Turnbull, Park Planner IV, offered a multi-media presentation regarding the Northwest Branch Disc Golf Course and Northwest Branch Trail.

Mr. Kines discussed the park planning process for the disc golf course including a brief overview of disc golf, policy guidance, site suitability and analysis, site selection, outreach and engagement, and the National Capital Trolley Museum (NCTM). Mr. Dintaman gave an overview of the park development including the scope of the project, design, welcome signage and course map, the project phasing, and estimated construction schedule. Lastly, Mr. Turnbull discussed the trail planning and gave an update on the Northwest Branch Trail extension and the Trolley Loop Trail.

The Board asked questions regarding community feedback, equipment needed, trail material makeup, design rating, estimated cost for the project, surrounding connecting trails, and if there was a fee to play.

Staff offered comments and responses to the Board's questions.

Debra Borden, General Counsel, gave an overview and briefed the Board on Bills HB 0724/ SB 0631 and SB 0832. Further information on the bills can be found under the Agenda for February 6, 2025.

Ms. Borden gave an overview and offered comments regarding Bill SB 0832 noting it involves Prince George's County only but recommended support for opposing the bill.

The Board asked if there were any municipalities in Prince George's County that have their own zoning authority, and Ms. Borden offered comments and responses. A motion was made, and the Board voted to oppose the bill as listed above.

Ms. Borden also discussed Bill HB 0724/SB 0631 and stated the bill would establish a new commission for Abandoned and Neglected Maryland Cemeteries within the Office of Cemetery Oversight. Ms. Borden stated there are topics that need to be clarified and noted the discussion as being informational only at this time.

The Board asked questions regarding the outcomes of old and full cemeteries, and Ms. Borden offered comments and responses.

Atara Margolies, Planner III, offered a multi-media presentation regarding the proposed Scope of Work for the Friendship Heights Sector Plan. Further information can be found in the Staff Report dated January 29, 2025.

Ms. Margolies discussed the history of Friendship Heights, the proposed Plan study area, the proposed Plan boundary, community engagement, key takeaways from the community engagement events, planning framework, Plan elements, equity, agency/government partners, and consultants involved. Lastly, Ms. Margolies noted a correction to the Scope of Work regarding Historic Resources/Planning History.

The Board asked questions regarding the Geico property, facilities included at Brookdale Neighborhood Park, consideration to include Western Grove Urban Park within the Plan boundary, reasoning for not including Vinton Park within the Plan boundary, and where the District of Columbia stands with their study of the area.

Staff, including Parks Long-Range Planning Supervisor, Henry Coppola, offered comments and responses to the Board's questions.

Item 7. Mandatory Referral No. MR2025007 and Forest Conservation Plan No. F20250240: Brighton Station STATCOM Expansion (Public Hearing)

Mark Beall, Planner IV, offered a multi-media presentation regarding the Brighton Station STATCOM Expansion. Further information can be found in the Staff Report dated January 27, 2025.

Mr. Beall stated Pepco is proposing to expand the existing Brighton Substation by 5 acres to construct a new STATCOM building, construct a secondary access point off the existing driveway, and install a new 30,000-gallon cistern for fire protection.

Josh Penn, Planner III, discussed the environmental guidelines, stream valley buffer impacts, the Patuxent River Management Area, and noted the Applicant's request for a waiver of the 10 percent impervious limit as the project will bring the overall imperviousness on the property to 12.25 percent. Mr. Penn also discussed the Forest Conservation Plan noting all the forest being retained for this project will be placed into a Standard Category I Conservation easement and a Modified Category I Conservation easement. A variance request for the removal of fourteen specimen trees and impacts to five trees has also been requested.

Mr. Beall also discussed the transportation access to the property as well as community correspondence received with concerns regarding the construction timeline, noise, and disruptions impacting surrounding neighbors.

Lastly, Mr. Beall noted the Applicant obtained approval of both a Stormwater Concept Plan and the Fire Department Access Plan.

Danielle Freedman and Asteway Ribbiso of Pepco offered comments and a multi-media presentation regarding Pepco's presence in the community, project justification, project overview, site details, the environmental aspects, project timeline, and community engagement.

The Board asked questions regarding substation operations, need for upgrading the current substation, reasoning for closure of the Baltimore plant location, and effects to the surrounding areas.

Rodwan Miludi of Pepco offered comments regarding the reasoning for the closure of the power plant location in Baltimore and effects on the surrounding areas.
