- 2 Maryland Department of Labor Study on Building Code Requirements for Single–Staircase Buildings
 - FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Department of Labor to study and make recommendations regarding building code requirements for single-staircase buildings; and generally relating to building code requirements for single-staircase buildings.
- 8 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 9 That:
- 10 (a) In this section, "Department" means the Maryland Department of Labor.
- 11 (b) The Department shall:
- 12 (1) conduct a study on building code requirements for single-staircase 13 buildings in the State and other states; and
- 14 (2) make recommendations regarding potential legislative or regulatory 15 changes to authorize the construction of single-staircase buildings up to six stories above 16 grade plane in the State for the purpose of increasing the affordable housing supply by 17 reducing barriers to multifamily housing development.
