SUBJECT: Special Appropriation FY26 – Clarksburg to Montgomery Village Corridor
Transportation Study, \$100,000

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Planning Board recommends approval of the Montgomery County Council's Special Appropriation to the Montgomery County FY26 Operating Budget, Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (M-NCPPC), Clarksburg to Montgomery Village Corridor Transportation Study, \$100,000 (Source of Funds: Montgomery County Government General Fund Undesignated Reserves).

BACKGROUND

This special appropriation was introduced by Councilmember Balcombe on July 29, 2025, to fund the completion of a comprehensive study of travel needs and master-planned transportation capacity in the Clarksburg to Montgomery Village Corridor. It would also fund the feasibility and timeline of implementing planned and existing master-planned transportation improvements along the corridor. This study was recommended in the Master Plan of Highways and Transitways – 2025 Technical Update.

The special appropriation is for the Planning Department, who would manage the project and work in coordination with the Montgomery County Department of Transportation (MCDOT).

Councilmembers Friedson and Luedke have listed themselves as cosponsors of this special appropriation.

A public hearing is scheduled for September 30, 2025, at 1:30pm.

REQUEST FOR THE SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION TO THE FY25 OPERATING BUDGET

On April 29, 2025, the Planning Board transmitted a draft technical update to the Master Plan of Highways and Transitways (MPOHT). This transmittal included a recommendation to conduct a comprehensive study of travel needs and master-planned transportation capacity in the Clarksburg to Germantown Corridor. Specifically, page 19 of the draft plan stated:

To ensure that there is sufficient transportation capacity to serve future travel demand in the Clarksburg to Germantown corridor, a comprehensive study of travel needs should be conducted to determine whether there is sufficient master-planned transportation capacity to accommodate planned development.

On July 21, 2025, the Council's Transportation and Environment Committee recommended amending the study provision of the MPOHT to also include the feasibility and timeline of implementing planned and existing master-planned transportation improvements and to include Montgomery Village in the extents of the Corridor. This additional language means that the Montgomery County Department of Transportation will need to play a co-equal role in this study. Specifically, the approved recommendation states:

To ensure that there is sufficient transportation capacity to serve existing and future travel demand in the Clarksburg to [Germantown] Montgomery Village corridor, a comprehensive study of travel needs should be conducted to determine whether there is sufficient master-planned transportation capacity to accommodate planned development, as well as the feasibility and timeline of implementing planned and existing master-planned transportation improvements.

On July 29, 2025, the County Council approved the Master Plan of Highways and Transitways – 2025 Technical Update, including the revised language about the Clarksburg to Montgomery Village corridor transportation study.

This special appropriation is intended to fund a study undertaken by the Planning Department, in coordination with the Montgomery County Department of Transportation (MCDOT), including any necessary consultant services.

ACTION

The Planning Board recommends approval of Supplemental Appropriation to fund this part of the amended work program for the Master Plan of Highway and Transitways.

SUBJECT: Special Appropriation to the FY26 Operating Budget Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission Clarksburg to Montgomery Village Corridor Transportation Study, \$100,000 (Source of Funds: General Fund Undesignated Reserves)

Background

1. Maryland Code, Land Use Section 18-108, provides that the Council may amend the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission's (M-NCPPC) approved budget by resolution. The Council may adopt the amendment after receiving the Executive's recommendation and holding a public hearing.
2. Section 308 of the County Charter provides that a special appropriation is an appropriation that states that it is necessary to meet an unforeseen disaster or other emergency, or to act without delay in the public interest. Each special appropriation shall be approved by not less than six Councilmembers. The Council may approve a special appropriation at any time after public notice by news release. Each special appropriation shall specify the source of funds to finance it.
3. On April 29, 2025, the M-NCPPC Montgomery County Planning Board transmitted a draft technical update to the Master Plan of Highways and Transitways (MPOHT). This transmittal included a recommendation to conduct a comprehensive study of travel needs and master-planned transportation capacity in the Clarksburg to Montgomery Village Corridor.
4. On July 21, 2025, the Transportation and Environment Committee recommended amending the study provision of the MPOHT to also include the feasibility and timeline of implementing planned and existing master-planned transportation improvements along the Clarksburg to Montgomery Village Corridor.
5. This special appropriation is intended to fund a study undertaken by the Planning Department, in coordination with the Montgomery County Department of Transportation (MCDOT), including any necessary consultant services.




High School Utilization and School Age
